SECTION 3: HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION

Emergency Overview:

DANGER! Pulmonary aspiration hazard if swallowed. Irritant.

Route of Exposure:

Eyes. Skin. Inhalation. Ingestion.

Potential Health Effects:

Eve:

Can cause moderate irritation, burning sensation, tearing, redness, and swelling.

Skin:

Causes skin irritation. Repeated or prolonged contact with the skin may cause dermatitis and allergic skin response in susceptible individuals.

Inhalation:

Respiratory tract irritant. High concentration may cause dizziness, headache, and anesthetic effects. Harmful if swallowed. Aspiration of material into the lungs can cause chemical pneumonitis which can

Overexposure can cause headaches, dizziness, nausea, and vomiting.

SECTION 4: FIRST AID MEASURES

Eye Contact:

Immediately flush eyes with plenty of water for at least 15 to 20 minutes. Ensure adequate flushing of

the eyes by separating the eyelids with fingers. Get immediate medical attention.

Skin Contact:

Immediately wash skin with plenty of soap and water for 15 to 20 minutes, while removing contaminated clothing and shoes. Get medical attention if irritation develops or persists.

If inhaled, remove to fresh air. If not breathing, give artificial respiration or give oxygen by trained Inhalation:

Ingestion:

SECTION 6: ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

Personal Precautions:

Evacuate area and keep unnecessary and unprotected personnel from entering the spill area.

Environmental Precautions:

Avoid runoff into storm sewers, ditches, and waterways.

Methods for containment:

Contain spills with an inert absorbent material such as soil, sand or oil dry.

Methods for cleanup:

Sweep up to prevent slipping hazard. Place into a suitable container for disposal. Provide ventilation. Clean up spills immediately observing precautions in the protective equipment section. After removal, flush spill area with soap and water to remove trace residue.

SECTION 7: HANDLING and STORAGE

Handling:

Use with adequate ventilation. Avoid breathing vapor, aerosol or mist.

Storage:

Store in a cool, dry, well ventilated area away from sources of heat, combustible materials, direct

sunlight, and incompatible substances. Keep container tightly closed when not in use.

Wash thoroughly after handling.

Engineering Controls:
